






For 39 years Allied Arts' mission, simply stated, has been to strengthen the Arts in Chattanooga . . .

- Advocate for the Arts

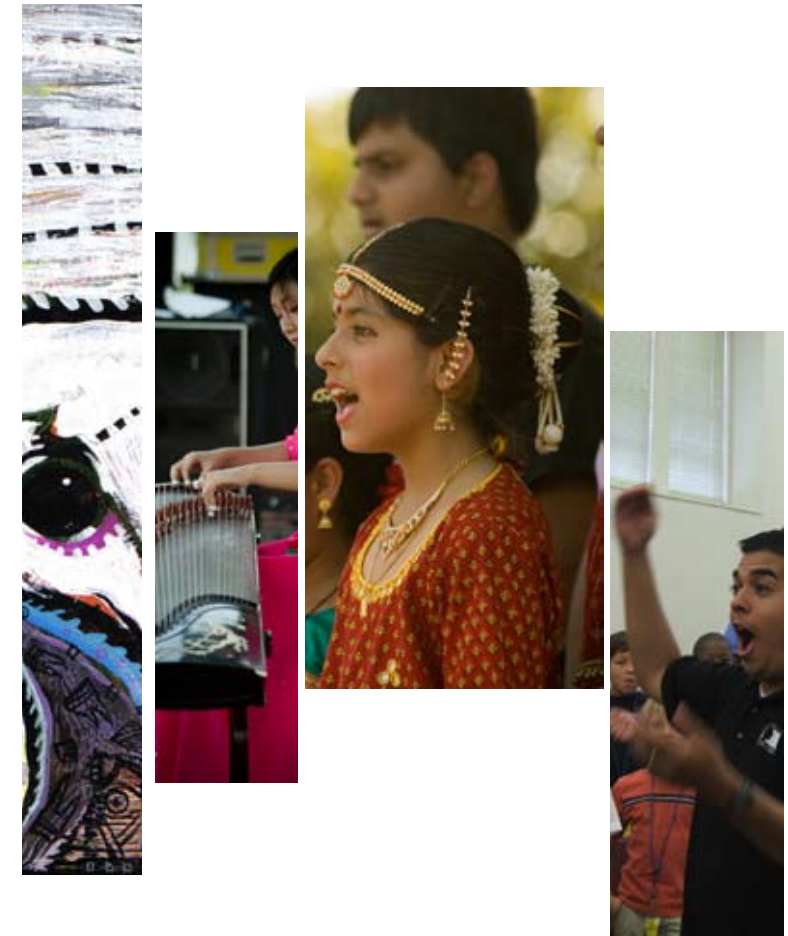
Because of your support we are able to concentrate on these four goals. If we do these things well the Arts will continue to thrive in Chattanooga.

Founded in 1969, Allied Arts is a non-profit united arts fund that has raised nearly \$50 million of support to nurture arts and cultural organizations in the greater Chattanooga area.

General Operating Support:

Allied Arts provides general operating support to year-round, established arts organizations in the community. Chattanooga Boys Choir \$42,900

makes more than 30 appearances annually, including the popular Singing Christmas Tree holiday concert

Chattanooga Girls Choir \$28,600

provides the only community-wide choir opportunity exclusively for girls in the Hamilton County area

GENERAL OPERATING SUPPORT . . .

Central to Allied Arts' mission is providing general operating support to established arts organizations in the community. Totalling \$1,716,495, these grants provide operating funds to agencies that are vital to the cultural life of the community and that have demonstrated long-term viability.

Chattanooga History Center \$71,500

collects, preserves and displays Chattanooga's history through its exhibitions and educational programs

Chattanooga Symphony & Opera \$539,000

the oldest combined symphony and orchestra in the nation, with a season of classical and opera productions and pops and family concerts

Chattanooga Theatre Centre \$178,750

produces a full season of professionally directed musicals, comedies and dramas, plus an award-winning Youth Theatre and a cutting edge Circle Series

Choral Arts \$8,250

presents an annual season featuring major choral works as well as a capella and chamber choral works

Creative Discovery Museum \$129,800

features 150 interactive exhibits that lead visitors to explore, understand, and enjoy the world in which they live

Houston Museum of Decorative Arts \$39,050

houses a nationally recognized collection of glass, porcelain, and early American furniture

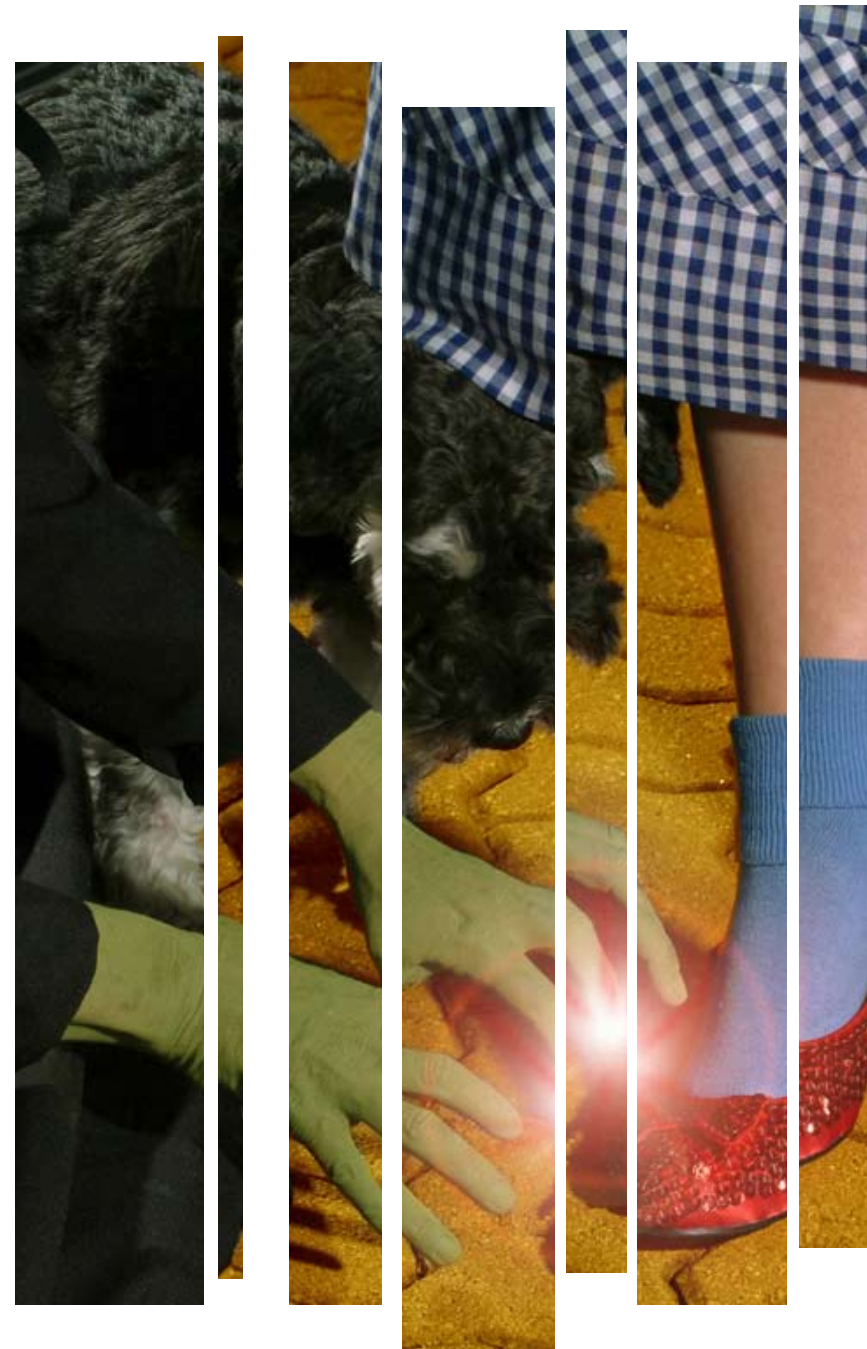
Ripe & Ready Players \$4,400

introduces innovative works in music, film, and performance and presents education programs in the schools and community





ARTS BUILD COMMUNITIES GRANTS . . .

ABC grants, funded by the Tennessee General Assembly and the Tennessee Arts Commission and administered by Allied Arts, this year awarded \$23,001 to traditional arts agencies as well as other non-profit organizations to provide support for arts projects in all disciplines. These programs reach deep into the community to provide access to the arts.

Chattanooga Festival of Writers - To support the craft of writing through workshops given by eight to ten award-winning writers

Ailey II Inner-City Outreach - To provide Ailey II master classes and tickets to an Ailey II performance for inner-city children

East Brainerd on Display - To present a traveling history/art project wherein participants listen to an oral history presentation and then transform the history onto fabric squares which will be made into a quilt to be displayed

Yom Hashoah Program - To partner with the Chattanooga Jewish Community Foundation to present a community concert on Yom Hashoah, the day of Holocaust Remembrance

Chattanooga Choral Society - \$1,000

Ellington Sacred Service Concert - To present the Ellington Sacred Service Concert and Workshop

Chattanooga Girls Choir - \$710

Choral Music Education Workshops - To provide a choral music education program to girls of Hispanic descent in grades 3 - 8

Chattanooga Symphony and Opera - \$1,500

Ensembles in Schools - To present the CSO Ensembles in Schools program to five inner-city Title 1 schools in Hamilton County

Chattanooga Theatre Centre - \$1,500

The Othello Project - To provide workshops of Shakespeare's great tragedy that will engage actors, designers, director, fight choreographer and producer from Chattanooga

Contemporary Performing Arts of Chattanooga - \$900

Emerge Dance - To present a performance of modern dance that synthesizes emotionally connected choreography and expression of abstract thought, in partnership with Contrapasso Modern Dance

Creative Discovery Museum - \$2,191

Tales Story-Residency Program - To support a week-long, after-school residency for children from Boys and Girls Clubs of Chattanooga to work with local storyteller Jim Pfitzer to create their own story

Chattanooga Downtown Partnership - \$1,100

Traditional Music at Ross's Landing Plaza - To support a free, summer weekend season of music programming featuring traditional Tennessee artists at Ross's Landing Plaza

Friends of Moccasin Bend National Park - \$2,000

Native American Performers at Riverbend Festival 2008 - To present a performance of "Blues Nation" musicians on one of the main stages at the 2008 Riverbend Festival

Hunter Museum of American Art - \$1,500

Joy and John Kasson: Gender Roles in American Art & Culture - To support a support a lecture by Drs. Joy and John Kasson discussing gender roles in the 19th and 20th centuries

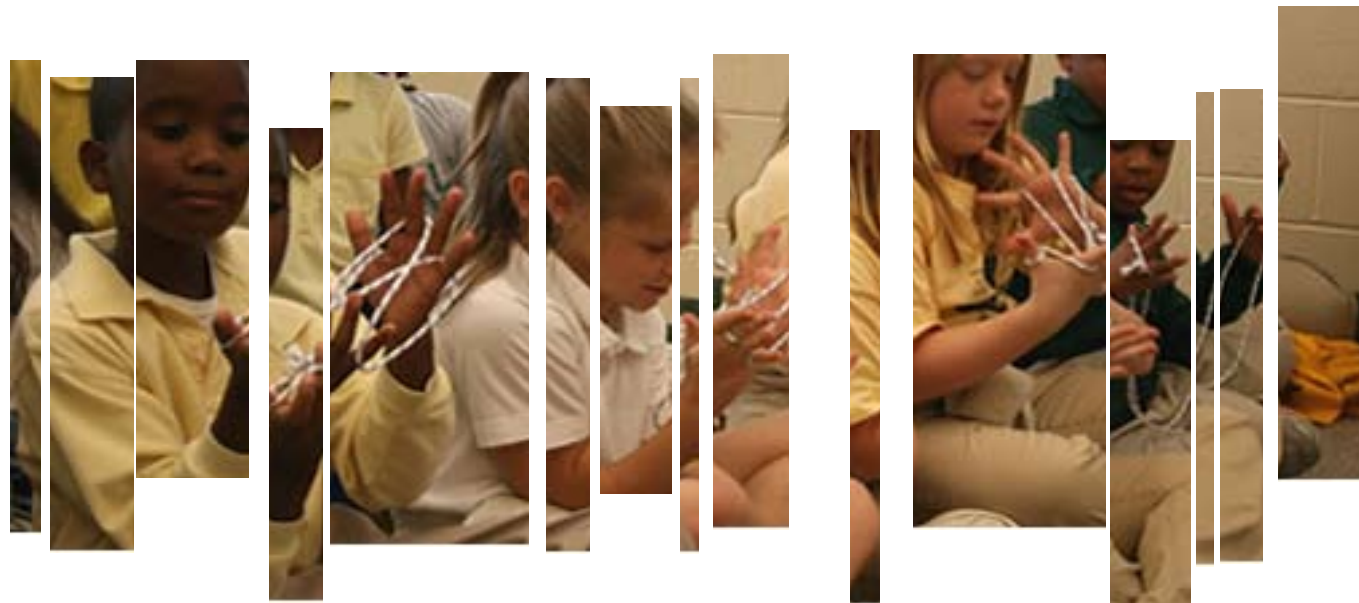

Arts Education . . .

Allied Arts has a strong commitment to make the arts a part of a complete education for every child. Allied Arts' unique programs have garnered national recognition and funding and have had a major impact on the successes of teachers and students each year. In 2007-2008, Allied Arts made over \$170,000 in grants to area schools that funded more than 850 arts experiences, and benefited more than 30,000 students.

Funding Partners . . .

Allied Arts' arts education programs are proud to have received support from the National Endowment for the Arts, the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, the Tennessee Arts Commission, the Starbucks Foundation, the Tucker Foundation, the George Johnson Foundation, IBM, UNUM, Bank of America, and Regions Bank.



Allied Arts' Arts Education Programs . . .

Local Kennedy Center Workshops

Allied Arts and the Hamilton County Department of Education (HCDE) collaborate as one of 98 partnership teams across the country participating in the Partners in Education Program of the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, D.C. Through this program, intensive workshops attended by more than 100 Hamilton County elementary school teachers were presented during the 2007-2008 school year, connecting the arts to literacy instruction. The workshops are funded through grants from the Tennessee Arts Commission and the Kennedy Center.

Student Ticket Subsidy

Student Ticket Subsidies enable students in public schools of the Southeast Tennessee Development District to attend cultural field trips or to invite performing groups and outreach programs to their schools. Funding for this program comes from the state legislature, administered by the Tennessee Arts Commission and Allied Arts.

Artist in Residence (AIR)

Through AIR, Allied Arts provides grants to bring artists into Hamilton County public schools. Resident teaching artists work in partnership with the classroom teacher to produce an educational experience connected to the classroom curriculum that is intellectually challenging and creatively stimulating.

Chattanooga Center for Creative Arts

Allied Arts provided funding for special artists in residence programs at this nationally recognized arts magnet school.

Allied Arts Schools

The goal of the Allied Arts Schools Program is to enable schools to design, refine, and implement school-wide plans to provide students with the basic skills, appreciation, and understanding of the arts. 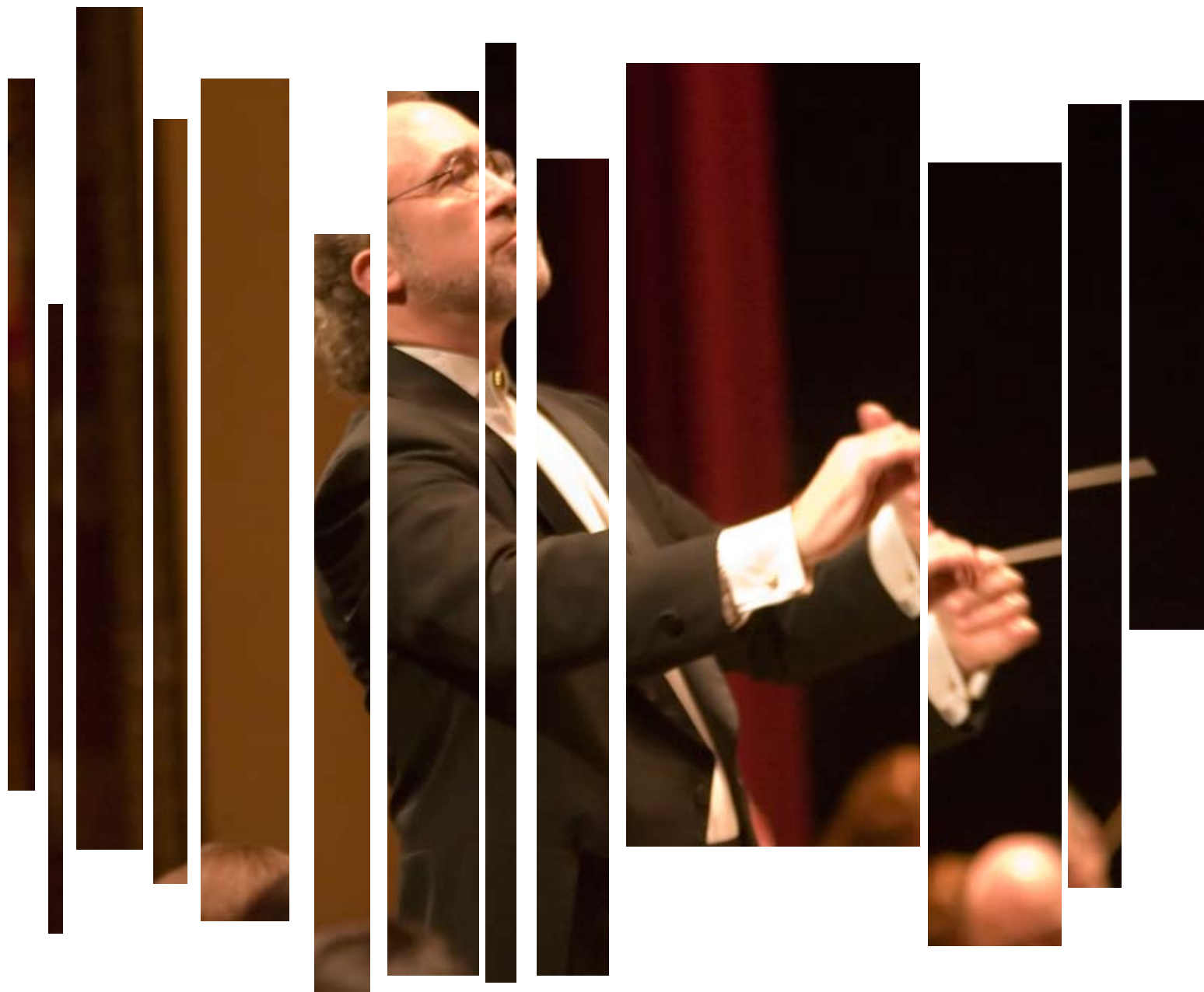
Allied Arts School Program

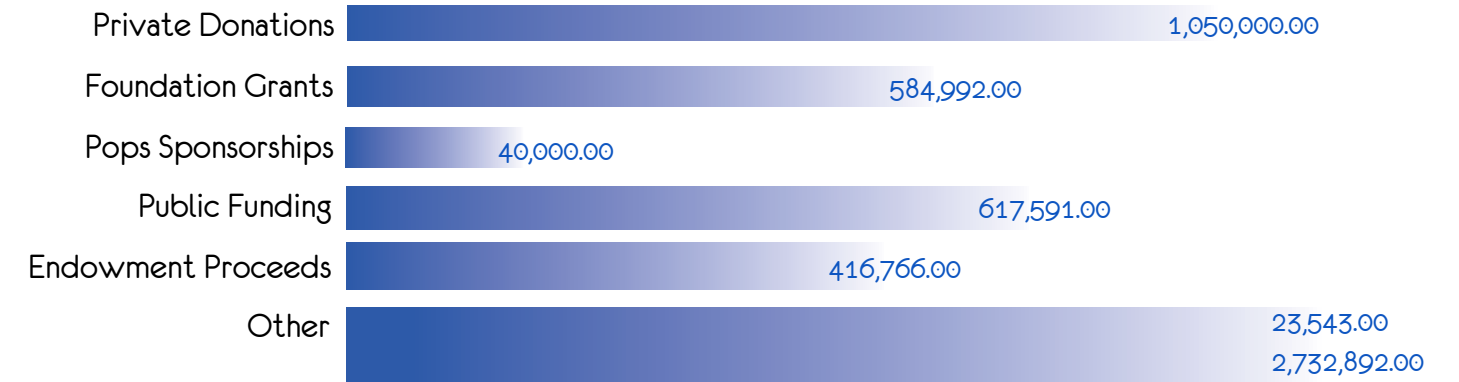

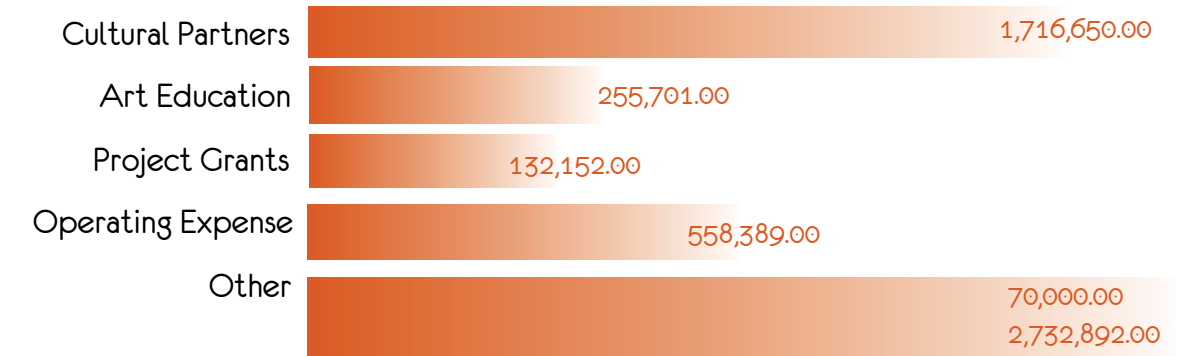
Allied Arts host for the Kennedy Center's International Fellows Mentoring Program Participant Andre Stephen Le Roux of South Africa visited Chattanooga March 7-14, 2008, to be mentored by Allied Arts of Greater Chattanooga and the local arts community after Allied Arts was selected by the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts to host a participant in its International Fellows Mentoring Program. As manager of the SAMRO Endowment, South Africa's equivalent of ASCAP, Mr. Le Roux is in charge of fundraising and support for arts education in South Africa through scholarship programs. During his visit to Chattanooga, Mr. Le Roux was immersed in the operations of Allied Arts. Mr. Le Roux visited the Hunter Museum of American Art and attended a performance of the Chattanooga Symphony and Opera. He learned about the not-for-profit arts world through meetings with Cultural Partner CEOs, Rob Kret (Hunter Museum), Molly Sasse (Chattanooga Symphony and Opera), Christa Mannarino (Association of Visual Arts), and Rose Martin (Chattanooga African American Museum). Mr. Le Roux toured Chattanooga Center for Creative Arts, a high school that has been recognized by the Kennedy Center as a national school of distinction for its arts education programs. Mr. Le Roux also met with Tennessee Arts Commissioner Ellen Hays.
